

African Cancer Leaders Institute (ACLI) Institut Africain des Leaders en Cancérologie Application Form

Background

The ACLI was conceived as a "meeting within a meeting" in collaboration with the African Organization for Research and Training in Cancer (AORTIC). In the past, ACLI participants have discussed cancer needs in Africa, core competencies in leadership, translating research into policy, national cancer plans, and interactions with partner organizations. ACLI participants have attended AORTIC scientific sessions, participated in meeting sessions designed specifically for the ACLI, as well as meeting with mentors individually. The long-term goal is to provide an intellectually stimulating platform for Emerging Global Cancer Research leaders from Africa and the US to receive mentorship and build a network to support innovative cancer research in Africa. The ACLI will form the basis of an African network for emerging leaders in cancer research in Africa, which itself will have annual goals and objectives set by a Steering Committee.

Overall Goal: The overall objective is to foster the development of the next generation of leaders in cancer research and practice in Africa, who can also serve in leadership roles within AORTIC. As the leading Cancer Organization in Africa, AORTIC has developed the platform to support interdisciplinary and interprofessional training to improve the quality of patient-centered cancer care in Africa.

Selection Criteria

Applicants are selected by the ACLI Selection Committee based on their potential to develop as global leaders in biomedical research, healthcare, industry, community engagement, advocacy, governmental liaison, or other critical areas of need for leadership in Africa. Membership in AORTIC and potential to take on a future leadership role in the Organization and/or other Africa based Institutions/Organizations focused on Cancer are major criteria for selection. We encourage applications from women, members of underserved and communities under-represented in research, and persons with disabilities. We will promote Diversity, Equity and Inclusion in the ACLI cohort in compliance with the Guidelines for Inclusion of Women, Minorities, and Persons with Disabilities in NIH-Supported Conference Grants policy.

Successful candidates for the ACLI will be individuals who show promise to lead initiatives and activities related to patient-centered cancer research in Africa. Ideal candidates are at junior to mid-level in their careers with demonstrable leadership experience. Special consideration will be given to those individuals who are involved in patient care or engaged in patient-oriented research relevant to Africa, or planning to apply for NIH research training grants or career development awards like K01/K08/K23/K43/K99/R01 and/or can provide a rationale for how they will contribute to the development of high-quality interdisciplinary and interprofessional cancer care in Africa. Candidates will be encouraged to demonstrate their interest and ability to commit to AORTIC and cancer leadership activities over the long term. African Cancer Leaders Institute will be particularly suitable for awardees of K43 Global Leadership Awards and Beginner Investigator Grant for Catalytic Research (BIGCAT) awards from the NCI.

The target audience for AORTIC includes physicians (oncologists, gastroenterologists, gynecologists, primary care physicians and surgeons), scientists, nurses, physician assistants and pharmacists from community and academic practices in Africa. However, International AORTIC participants have come from countries in Europe, North America, Middle East and the UK to mention a few. Through this funding mechanism, ACLI will provide special incentives for senior leaders to invite their junior investigators/emerging leaders to attend AORTIC and participate in ACLI. Long-term, it is expected that AORTIC will create a community of Emerging Leaders to drive innovations to provide high quality cancer care in Africa through research.

ACLI Participation

ACLI participants are expected to complete the following ACLI-supported activities:

- 1. Attend the AORTIC 2023 conference in Dakar, Senegal (2-6 November 2023)
- 2. Develop a two-page proposal (goals, activities, timeline) within the candidate's area of interest and expertise that has the potential to impact cancer patients and their family members in Africa.
- 3. Identify a potential ACLI mentor before the conference to establish longitudinal mentoring relationships
- 4. Identify specific leadership activities that can be facilitated by AORTIC to strengthen AORTIC's impact on cancer in Africa.
- 5. Participate in joint AORTIC/ACLI sponsored regional meetings such as the Africa Cancer Regional Conference inaugurated in Senegal in 2022, workshops, satellite meetings, and other activities to compliment the professional competencies of ACLI participants.
- **6.** Participate in ACLI Alumni network and long term evaluation.
